SkyWest Airlines Begins Delta Connection Service from San Luis Obispo, Calif. to Salt Lake City

The airline will utilize the 50-passenger Bombardier manufactured CRJ200 aircraft.

To celebrate the new Salt Lake City service, SkyWest Airlines, Delta Air Lines and the airport are hosting a welcoming reception from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the main terminal at the San Luis Obispo County Regional Airport. The inaugural Delta flight 3862 will depart for Salt Lake City at 12:30 p.m.
