SkyWest operates as United Express in partnership with United Airlines along the West Coast and out of United's Denver and Chicago hubs. At Salt Lake City, SkyWest provides service as Delta Connection under a marketing agreement with Delta Air Lines. And SkyWest flies as Midwest Connect in partnership with Midwest Airlines out of its Milwaukee and Kansas City hubs.
